Staff and Legal Review (September 2016)



- Staff Understanding:
 - Draft Policy 2016-3 allows for organizations to double the size of their current IPv4 holdings (up to and including a /16) through an 8.3 or 8.4 specified transfer without a needs assessment being conducted by ARIN staff, as long as they can demonstrate 80% utilization of their current holdings. Organizations would still be able to qualify under the current policy by showing their 24 month need.

- Staff Comments:
 - This policy could be implemented as written.

Staff and Legal Review (continued)



- Legal Assessment:
 - This policy presents no material legal issues.

Staff and Legal Review (continued)



- Resource Impact:
 - Implementation of this policy would have minimal resource impact. It is estimated that implementation would occur within 3 months after ratification by the ARIN Board of Trustees.
