Our Focus for 2019

- Preparing for strong membership growth and anticipated fall-off after our IPv4 pool is finished
- Ensuring accuracy of the RIPE Registry
- Focus on due diligence and fraud prevention
- Adding value through our training services
- Providing neutral information, tools and measurements to support the RIPE community
- Strengthening the K-root server infrastructure



Abuse-c Validation

- Policy proposal was accepted in June 2018
- Asked us to check abuse contacts in the RIPE Database and follow-up with resource holders to fix outdated information
- Implementation started in February 2019
- Automated verification tool followed by manual intervention where needed



RIPE NCC Certified Professionals

- Online proctored exams
 - Verifies the identity of the candidate taking the exam
 - Skill-based exam questions, integrating both theory and exercises
 - Extensive job task analysis and stakeholder consultations to align certifications with industry needs
 - Vendor-neutral content

Policy Discussions

- 2019-03: BGP Hijacking is a RIPE Policy Violation
 - Aims to clarify that an intentional hijack is a policy violation
- 2019-02: Reducing IPv4 allocation size to a /24 once the RIPE NCC is no longer able to allocate /22s
- 2019-01: Clarification of Definition for "ASSIGNED PA"
- 2018-06: RIPE NCC IRR Database Non-Authoritative Route **Object Clean-up**



Approaching IPv4 Run-out




RIPE NCC Membership is Growing...



Unprecedented growth in 2018 Membership expected to reach 24,000 LIRs by end of 2019




IPv4 Addresses in our Pool (Millions)

Allocation Process

- from our pool of returned IPv4 addresses
- and (24s)
- will have reached run-out
- Run-out expected for February 2020
 - Actual date will vary according to membership growth

• Now that the last /8 is gone, we are allocating contiguous /22s

When we can no longer allocate contiguous blocks, we will make /22 allocations out of the smallest-routable blocks (/23s

Once we can no longer make a /22 equivalent allocation, we



Considerations

- How can we handle run-out in a way that is fair, transparent and efficient?
- How should we handle the possibility that members might have to spend time on a waiting list or not get any IPv4 at all?
- Complex changes to our internal/external software will need to be made ahead of time
- We need to keep members and other stakeholders informed as we approach run-out



What Run-out Means for the RIPE Community

- Extending the lifespan of IPv4 as a technology possibly slowing or delaying IPv6 adoption
- Possibly adding complexity to the routing table
 - (Though we haven't seen evidence of this to date)
- New kinds of actors in the RIPE Policy Development Process, and in the RIPE community generally
- Greater attention/involvement from governments and regulators who may view IPv4 as an economic issue





What Run-out Means for the RIPE NCC

- Transfer market reinforces the importance of the registry Impacts the dynamic between the RIPE NCC and our
- members
- New services and processes required
- Speculators, hoarders and hijackers with greater incentive to abuse the system
- A need to make sure we maintain the right balance between due diligence and not being overly bureaucratic



RIPE NCC Survey

- Launches at RIPE 78
- Our last survey gathered input from 4,400 people
- Crucial for guiding our strategy
- This will be our last survey before IPv4 exhaustion
