

ARIN Transfer Policy


To transfer IPs or ASNs, the new entity must:

- a. Demonstrate it acquired the assets that justified the former entity's allocation.
- b. Show justification, including:
 - 1) An authenticated copy of the instrument(s) effecting the transfer such as:
 - Bill of sale, certificate of merger, contract, deed, court decree
 - 2) A detailed statement depicting utilization at time of acquisition
- c. Provide additional information if requested by ARIN

Common Mythconception #1

- Web hosters are ravenously gobbling up the ARIN IPv4 space!
 - Verio (a large web hoster): hosts around
 500,000 web sites (worst case: 500,000 IPs)
 - @Home (a mid-tier ISP): has over 2 million subscribers (allocation: 2.3 million IPs)
 - By ARIN policy, fast growing ISPs that use
 /14s in 3 months can get /13s now!
- Web hosters cause relatively small impact!

Common Mythconception #2

- ARIN is reasonable about IP justification,
 so the policy will not cause undue hardship.
 - Policies are aggressively enforced by ISPs,
 IDCs, managed co-location providers, etc.
 - ARIN themselves is usually not involved in allocation requests from small web hosters
 - Exceptions are poorly defined, leaving the upstream provider rigidly in control
- Vague policy impedes small web hosters!

Summary of Issues

- HTTP 1.0 browsers
- Web hosting is NOT merely HTTP
 - FTP
 - POP3/IMAP
 - Telnet
- Search Engine incompatibility
- Microsoft FrontPage server extensions
- Filtering/Blocking software

Summary of Issues (cont.)

- SSL protocol issues
- Bandwidth measurement/throttling
- Business-support systems which are IPbased (automated billing, etc.)
- Complex/Secure virtual hosting services
 - Performance and reliability of shared servers
 - Increased impact of DOS attacks and bugs
 - Shared hosting environment security

Possible Alternatives

- IPv6, the REAL solution
 - Too distant, need more timely solution?
 - Should ARIN aggressively pursue?
- Protocol changes (ala HTTP 1.1)
- IPv4 reclamation
 - Already some positive results
 - Should ARIN pursue/audit "pioneers"?
 - Where's the authority to reclaim?

Possible Alternatives (cont.)

- NAT for ISPs
 - More secure, better control, possible revenue
- DNS Extensions
 - Domain administrator defines ports that services run on within network
- Super-duper Ultra-Creative Hithertounheard-of Grand Master Solution
 - Anybody?



AS Number Request Criteria

- Unique Routing Policy
 - Must demonstrate that routing policies are different from border gateway peers
- Multi-homed Site
 - Must be multi-homed or will immediately become multi-homed, and must describe:
 - Exterior gateway protocol to be used
 - IP network addresses that will make up the AS
 - Technical POC information for each upstream provider/peer, including...
 - Full name
 - Email address



AS Number Request Background

 Almost all AS number requests are for multihomed sites

 Of these, the majority are from dual homed sites.





AS Growth




Exponential Regression

Predicted AS Growth




Exponential vs Quadratic






Exponential vs Quadratic
