If an organization, whether a member or non-member, ISP or enduser, relinquishes a group of non-aggregatable address blocks to ARIN, they shall be allowed to select a block in exchange, of no less than /24, and no more than the next greater than the sum of the blocks relinquished. For example, if an organization relinguished three /24s, they should be allowed to take either a /24, a /23, or a /22 in exchange. If all of the previous address blocks were maintained in the ARIN database without maintenance fees, the replacement space shall be as well, but if any one of the returned blocks had associated maintenance fees, then the replacement block shall also be subject to maintenance fees.
