

Registration Activities (1)

- Number of LIRs
 - Growth slowing for new members
 - Industry consolidation
- New IPv6 requests since 1 July 2002
 - 40 New IPv6 Allocations
 - 34 /35s expanded to /32
 - http://www.ripe.net/ipv6/ipv6allocs.html
 - 26 /32s delegated in ip6.arpa



Registration Activities (2)

- Secure Member Web Portal
 - Beta launched at RIPE 43, in September
 - Planned to be an official service during Q1, 2003
- New robot for hostmaster@ripe.net built
- All outgoing Hostmaster mail PGP signed
- New membership procedure from September
 - Faster and easier



Registration Services (3)

- Early Registration Transfer Project
 - ASNs began 21 August 2002 and now complete
 - Close co-ordination with ARIN
 - Preparing for IPv4 transfer
 - Task Force set up to get input from registrants
- e164.arpa delegation (ENUM)
 - ITU is responsible for authorising delegations
 - RIPE NCC runs DNS on behalf of IAB/IETF
 - 13 delegations to date



RIPE 43 Policy Update

- Temporary assignments for Internet experiments
 - Accepted
 - RIPE NCC to prepare a draft policy text for inclusion in IPv4, IPv6 and ASN policy docs
- Sub-Allocation proposal
 - Accepted
 - RIPE NCC to prepare draft implementation plan
- ASN Policy
 - No change to policy
 - Community agrees there is no realistic way to check for "multi-homing" of an ASN



Documentation Renewal

- All IPv4 and IPv6 documentation renewed
- DB Operation Manual
 - Separate HOWTO shipped with the distribution
 - Finally: Installation, configuration and maintenance guide
- DB User Manual
 - "Getting Started" written in co-operation with APNIC
 - Final phase in progress




Training Activities

- LIR Training courses
 - 60% increase in courses given since 2000
 - est. ~1900 people trained
 - 75–85 Courses planned for 2003
- DNS Sec Training Courses
 - 4 given in Q4 2002
 - ~10 planned for 2003
- Routing Registry for LIRs
 - Currently being developed
 - ~10 planned for 2003



Database Statistics

- 1.6 M Objects
- Query Rate 18/sec
 70% IP
 20% domain
- Update Rate 2/min 60 % IP 25 % person 10 % domain





Database Developments (1)

- Security developments
 - New MD5-PW authentication scheme
 - MAIL-FROM auth no longer available
 - IRT object representing CSIRT
- Routing Registry
 - RRCC is fully functional http://www.ripe.net/db/rrcc
 - IRRToolSet support
 http://www.ripe.net/db/irrtoolset
 - latest release available on our ftp site



Database Developments (2)

- New prototypes
 - Interactive updates

 - User friendly web interface for updates
 https://webupdates-test.ripe.net
 - Moving to production soon



Database Plans

- Further improvement of server software
 - Error reporting
 - Performance
 - Configuration management
- New features
 - Support for authorisation checks across multiple registries
 - IPv6 and multicast support in the RR
 - Automatic database clean-up




New Projects (1)

- Test Traffic Measurements
 - Version using CDMA instead of GPS as a clock source
 - Full IPv6 support
- Routing Information Service (RIS)
 - BGP beacons (Flapping statistics)
 - AS112 blackhole server
- DNS Sec getting ready for deployment
 - Protocol and tool development
 - Implementation testing
 - Plan to offer DNS Sec on reverse tree as a service by Mid 2003
 - Signing procedure will run in parallel with existing delegation procedure
