Survey Purpose

Community interested in IPv6 deployment experiences Determine needs of ARIN membership



Survey Description

- Survey e-mailed to point of contact for /35 and /32 registrants
- Survey began in January 2003
- ***** ARIN committed to:
 - Not disclose company name of participants
 - Not disclose vendor names mentioned in survey
- * 35 survey forms were distributed, 10 were completed and returned to ARIN (29%)



Survey Questions

* Questions focused on

- Implementation experiences
- Customer demand
- # 10 questions included in survey



* Question 1:

Have you implemented your IPv6 network yet? If not, do you have a planned date for implementation?

Response Summary:

- Yes (6)
- ► No (4)
 - Two responded they are only in experimental phase

All (4) plan to implement by end of year 2003



***** Question 2:

- How are you using your IPv6 allocation?
- ***** Response Summary:
 - To number backbone network in anticipation of customer demand
 - Experimenting with other IPv6 networks to prepare for roll-out of service to customers
 - Research and testing in anticipation of customer demand



***** Question 3:

Do you peer with other IPv6 networks? If so, how many peers do you have?

Response Summary:

- (6) responded positively responses identified 1 to 40 peers
- (4) stated they are not currently peering with anyone (IPv6 network not yet deployed)



***** Question 4:

- What IPv6 network services are you currently able to provide to your customers?
- Response Summary:
 - Native transit for co-located customers
 - Tunnel connections
 - DNS
 - Native transit in major markets and tunnel connections in smaller markets
 - Hosting services



***** Question 5:

- Do you have IPv4 -to- IPv6 transitional mechanisms in place?
- Response Summary:
 - All responded "no" to this question



***** Question 6:

Have you made assignments to customers from your allocation? If so, how many and what size?

***** Response Summary:

- (4) responded that they have
- /48s and /64s are being assigned



***** Question 7:

- Have any of your customers requested more than one IPv6 assignment?
- Response Summary:
 - Most responded "no"
 - One stated they could not imagine a customer ever needing more than a /48
 - One responded "yes"



***** Question 8:

- Are you seeing a demand for IPv6 services from your customers?
- ***** Response Summary:
 - Some said yes Some quotes:
 - "Interest from many, demand from only a handful"
 - "Occasionally. Not a highly pressing demand yet."
 - "Not substantially"
 - "No, not really."
 - "Yes. Mostly from customers in Asia."



***** Question 9:

- Are there any notable barriers that have prevented the deployment of your IPv6 network or services?
- Response Summary:
 - Some quotes:
 - "Headcount and capital, it's a low priority project."
 - "Customer demand."
 - "There has been a general lack of interest from our members. This may because it's missing the killer app or reason to migrate."
 - "Engineering knowledge of v6, (which is weak), NOC knowledge of v6, (which may even be nonexistent.)"



***** Question 10:

- Are there any experiences that you would like to share with other ISPs and members of the community that may help them deploy their own IPv6 network?
- Response Summary:
 - Most responded they are not ready to do this at this time

- Desire to keep the survey short
- Coordination with other RIR IPv6 surveys
- Results to be reported at ARIN XII in October
