ARIN Public Policy Process

- ◆ Internet Policy Evaluation Process
- ◆ deals with rules by which Internet numbering resources are managed
 - (does not deal with ARIN fee or governance issues)
- ◆ it is the way that ARIN revises current rules
- ◆ it is the way that ARIN develops new rules

Background

- ◆ Existing Process Document in Use Since April 2000
- ◆ Process Improvements Sought in 2003
 - Three years of use revealed areas of needed improvement
 - Ideas for updating document discussed at ARIN XI
Memphis meeting
 - Process updates discussed on PPML
- ◆ New Process Draft Published on October 8, 2003

Principles

- ◆ open & transparent process
- ◆ anyone can submit a policy proposal
- ◆ significant AC role
- ◆ low curb escape process if AC does not support
- ◆ public comment on open mailing list is part of process
- ◆ discussion at face-to-face PP meeting
- ◆ BoT does final adoption

Submitting a Policy Proposal

- ◆ anyone can submit a proposal (including AC)
 - use template on web page
- ◆ proposal sent to policy@arin.net
- ◆ proposal must include
 - proposal contact point
 - proposed policy (with specific language!)
 - arguments for policy
 - proposed implementation timetable
- ◆ proposals posted to ARIN web site as-is
 - on page that says these are submitted proposals
 - does not get a proposal #

Initial Review

- ◆ AC does initial review of suggested proposals
 - a/ can support as-is
 - b/ can work with authors to
 - reword for clarity &/or combine proposals
 - c/ can decide to not support
- ◆ petition-based process if AC does not support
 - 4 additional people from different organization must support

Posting Policy Proposals

- ◆ proposal becomes “formal” if AC supports or if petition process succeeds
- ◆ formal proposals get a tracking number
- ◆ formal proposals get posted to ARIN web site & announced on PP list
- ◆ must be posted at least 30 days before a PP meeting to be discussed at that PP meeting
- ◆ mailing list discussion encouraged

Public Policy Meeting

- ◆ all formal proposals
 - get scheduled discussion time at the PP meeting
- ◆ separate discussion at ARIN member's meeting if MM more than 3 days separate PPM & MM

2nd Advisory Council Review

- ◆ AC reviews discussion at PPM (and MM if separate) and mailing list discussion
- ◆ list & in-person comments given equal weight
- ◆ AC options - find that the community:
 - a/ supports proposal as-is
 - b/ wants AC to work with authors to reword for clarity &/or combine proposals
 - if so - proposal recycled to pre-PPM status
 - c/ wants to abandon proposal
- ◆ AC announces their decision on PP mailing list

Last-Call for Comments

- ◆ open call for comments on PP mailing list
- ◆ 10 (working) day period after AC announces their decision
- ◆ if competing proposals
 - last call response needs to say which (if any) to select
 - at most one will be adopted

Last-Call Petition Process

- ◆ if AC decides community wants to abandon a proposal
- ◆ author may decide to petition to overcome AC rejection
 - ◆ sends note to PP mailing list with URL of proposal and request for support
- ◆ 10 (working) day timeframe
- ◆ people from 10 different organizations must support for petition to succeed
- ◆ if support shown then proposal sent to BoT

AC Last-Call Review

- ◆ AC reviews comments on PP mailing list
- ◆ AC options - find that the community:
 - a/ supports proposal as-is - proposal sent to BoT
 - b/ wants AC to work with authors to reword for clarity &/or combine proposals
 - if so - revised proposal recycled for new Last-Call
 - c/ wants to abandon proposal
- ◆ AC announces their decision on PP mailing list

Competing Proposals

- ◆ if there were competing proposals Last-Called
- ◆ AC options - find that the community:
 - a/ supports one proposal as-is - proposal sent to BoT
 - b/ wants AC to work with authors to reword for clarity &/or combine proposals
 - if so - revised proposal recycled for new Last-Call
 - c/ wants to abandon proposal
- ◆ AC announces their decision on PP mailing list

ARIN BoT

- ◆ BoT will consider proposals forwarded by AC and any recommendation AC makes
 - can be done at regular or special board meeting
- ◆ BoT may return policy to AC for clarification
 - AC can provide clarification information or work with author to revise proposal and issue new Last-Call
- ◆ BoT can reject proposal
 - must send explanation to PP mailing list
- ◆ BoT can accept proposal as-is
 - reported in BoT minutes

Emergency Policies

- ◆ BoT can declare an “emergency policy”
- ◆ posted to PP mailing list
 - 10(working) day comment period
- ◆ rest is same process as for normal policies
 - but skip presentation at PP & M meetings
- ◆ presented at next PP & M meetings if BoT adopts policy
 - can be overturned by community consensus
 - in effect unless overturned

Next Steps

- ◆ sort of follow the proposed process
- ◆ modify proposal based on this discussion if needed
- ◆ 10 (working) day Last-Call after “final” version posted
- ◆ AC review results of Last-Call
tweak&recycle or forward to BoT with recommendation
- ◆ BoT consider adopting
