## Current Status

- This policy was reviewed and voted on at the last ARIN Conference.
- This proposed policy received the majority yes vote for it to become its own separate ARIN policy pending a main statement re-write.
- The main statement was discussed on the PPML and among the AC Council. Suggestions of how to re-write the main statement were taken and integrated from all input provided.



## New Improved Statement

- Policy Proposal 2004-3: Global Addresses for Private Network Inter-Connectivity
- Policy statement:

Private networks may obtain global addresses for private network usage. Hosts within the administrative control of a single organization should still use private address space in accordance with RFC-1918 and RFC-2050. Private networks may receive global IP's for private Interconnectivity if they have already used private IP space in accordance with RFC-1918 and RFC-2050 and any further use of private IP space would result in network conflicts.
