Staff Impact Analysis

- * NRPM Section 3.5 (new)
- * Present Reassignment information is publicly available
- * Change Reassignment information would be private, unless an ISP chooses to make them public
- * Departments reported no significant operational impact, except for Engineering:
 - Modifications
 - database schema to identify private records
 - templates
 - registration software
 - WHOIS and AUP dump tools
 - Development of reporting tool(s) to provide private records to authorized POCs
 - Approximately 280-300 hours to implement
