Scope What is policy? (what vs. how)

* "Policies are documented community decisions that determine the rules by which Internet numbering resources are managed and administered by ARIN."

* "Practice and procedure is how ARIN conducts its operations... discussions regarding ARIN fees..." are not part of the policy process.

Internet Resource Policy Evaluation Process (IRPEP) - History of the Process

- *Prior to April 1, 2001
- Internet Resource Policy Evaluation Process – published April 1, 2001
- Current Version published January ARIN 2/2 2004

Internet Resource Policy Evaluation Process

Translations: Arabic French Spanish Swahili

This version of the ARIN Internet Resource Policy Evaluation Process was published on January 22, 2004. It supersedes <u>the</u> <u>previous version</u>.

PRINCIPLE

ARIN's Internet resource policies are developed in an open and transparent manner by the Internet community. Anyone may participate in the process - ARIN membership is not required. Policies are ratified by the ARIN Board of Trustees only after a full public discussion is held, review and recommendation by the ARIN Advisory Council is made, and there is evidence that a consensus for the policy has been reached among the community, in accordance with the process described in this document. This Internet Resource Policy Evaluation Process defines how policy is established in the APIN region

1 closed




Policy Development Principles

* Bottom up – community consensus * Open and transparent > Anyone may participate – mailing list and meetings > Documented process

Published meeting minutes – BoT, AC, meetings

Advisory Council

Initial Review

Determine rough consensus

- Shepherd proposals
 - Works with authors
 - Present on behalf of authors who can not attend the meeting
- Last Call Review
- Attend other meetings (RIR, IETF, etc.)
- AC Members author proposals



Board of Trustees

Overall - Responsible for business affairs and financial health of ARIN

- Specific to the policy process Ratify that the process was followed
- Special cases
 - Emergency Policy
 - Policy Suspension

*Should participate in discussion *Should work with the AC *Should revise proposal text as appropriate *Should petition when appropriate After the AC Initial Review After the AC Evaluation Review

Results

- *Policy that is reviewed by, and is decided by the community
 *Policy that serves the interest of the community
- *Successful use of the policy development process allows you to regulate yourselves

How to Participate

*Mailing list (PPML)
