Policies Reviewed

- Immediate Need
- ISP Additional Requests
- End-User Additional Requests
- Transfer



Immediate Need Policy

Policy - NRPM 4.2.1.6

"If an ISP has an immediate need for address space, i.e., the need exists the day of the request, ARIN may issue a /20 if the organization, such as a new company, shows justification."

Current practice

- Need must be within 30 days
- Applied to ISPs AND end-users

• Questions/Issues

- Should "/20" be changed to read "ARIN's current minimum allocation/assignment size"?
- Should immediate need be a defined timeframe?
- Should the policy apply to both ISPs and end-users?



ISP Additional Request Policy

Policy text – NRPM 4.2.4.3.

"When completing Section 7 of the ARIN ISP
Network Request Template, please keep this in
mind."

- Question/Issue
 - Incorrect reference to template name and section
- Recommendation
 - Delete entire sentence



Policy for End-Users Additional Requests

- No policy defined
- Current practice
 - 80% utilization of last assignment
 - Provide utilization details
- Question/Issue
 - Should the community define a policy?



Transfer Policy

Policy – NRPM Section 8

"IP address space assignments are non-transferable and are not assignable to any other organization..."


Question/Issue

Random, inconsistent use of terms IP addresses and ASNs

Recommendation

Replace all references to IP address assignment, allocations, and/or ASNs with "Internet Number Resources"
