

"However, this type of policy may have a series of impacts in different portions of the Internet community. Let me give a single example: Law enforcement authorities have a desire for real time ability to obtain information of the type that will now be masked. This may increase the burden on ISP's who must be correspondingly contacted more often to obtain such information. The government's might wish a different policy. Issues of customer privacy and how ARIN's policies impact such issues remains an area of ongoing legal concern and attention."
