# 2008-7 - Summary

- **Annual re-registration of all POCs in WHOIS**
  - POCs who don't respond marked "unresponsive".
  - Staff may remove invalid POCs from database.
  - Staff to maintain list of number resources that lack valid POCs (data to be available via bulk WHOIS policy criteria).

# 2008-7 - Staff Assessment

<p><b>Legal: Liability Risk?</b></p> <p><i>"It is possible those delisted will threaten or file litigation to be relisted. However, a properly promulgated policy does not pose antitrust or other legal concerns."</i></p>	<p><b>Some</b></p>
<p><b>Staff Comments: Issues/Concerns?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- May help hijackers</li><li>- Increase in workload (there are approx. 233K POCs)</li><li>- Staff would prefer specific access criteria</li></ul>	<p><b>Yes</b></p>
<p><b>Staff Implementation: Resource Impact?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Training, internal procedures, automated tracking system, additional staff</li><li>- 18 person months</li></ul>	<p><b>Significant</b></p>

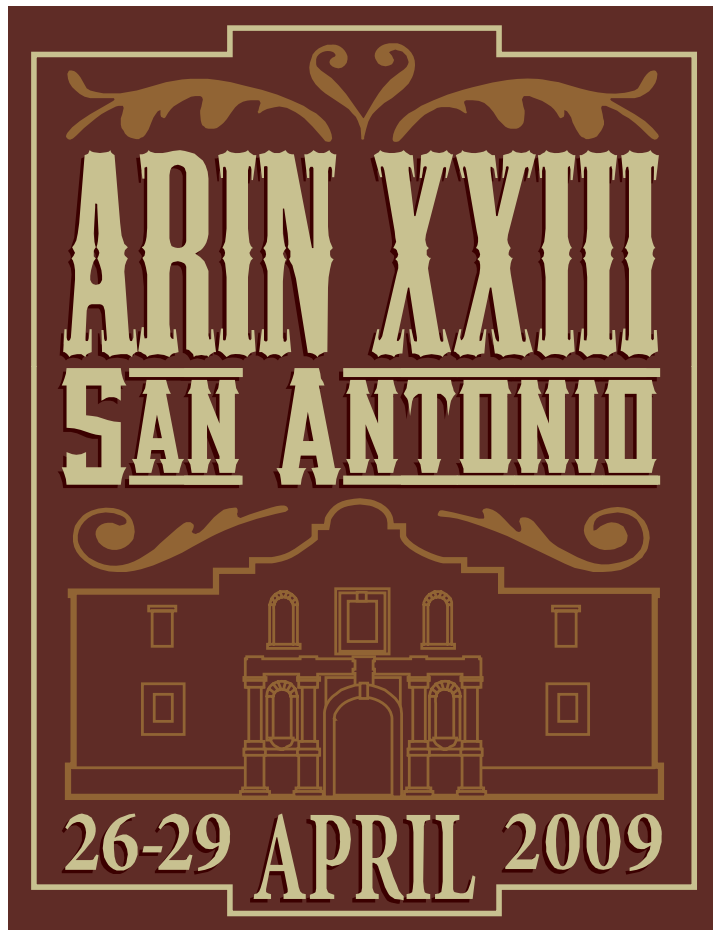
