



Internet Registry System Organizations

ICANN	 Top level coordination of the Internet identifiers (domain names, numbers
(IANA)	 Manage global unallocated IP address pool Allocate number resources to RIRs
RIR	 Manage regional unallocated IP address pool Allocate number resources to ISPs/LIRs Assign number resources to End-users
ISP/LIR	 Manage local IP address pool for use by customers and for infrastructure Allocate number resources to ISPs Assign number resources to End-users



Regional Internet Registries

- The Regional Internet Registry (RIR) system began in 1992
- There are five RIRs
- RIRs coordinate closely with IANA
- All RIRs are nonprofit, community-driven organizations





ARIN's region includes Canada, many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands, and the United States.


American Registry for Internet Numbers

 - facilitates the advancement of the Internet through information and educational outreach.


ARIN's Services

 - Participates in the global Internet community

 - Is a nonprofit, membership organization
 - Is governed by an elected executive board


