2011-4 – Summary

This policy would reserve a /16 equivalent for issuing under the IPv4 micro-allocations for critical infrastructure policy (NRPM 4.4). If any of the reserved addresses are unused 36 months after implementation, ARIN may use the addresses for other purposes.

APNIC and RIPE NCC Similar policy already adopted.





2011-4 – Staff Assessment

Staff Comments: Issues/Concerns?

- Suggestion to specifically state "critical infrastructure as defined in NRPM Section 4.4" – This was done.
- 2. Put the policy term in the policy text: change "at the end of the policy term" to "36 Months following implementation".

- Earlier discussion of proposal: 53 posts by 19 people (6 in favor and 1 against)
- "Cl is definitely outside the intended scope of 4.10 and [this proposal] is needed."
- "Perhaps the policy proposal could be revised to require all critical infrastructure applicants justifying and applying for reserved space, be required to show plans for parallel IPv6 deployment of new infrastructure?"
